- Gadwall	4	2/8/81	Cedar River in Cedar Falls unusual for the time of year - Bob Myers
- Green-winged Teal	1	2/8/81	Cedar River in Cedar Falls; a female in a group of Gadwall and Mallards. Bird was small as compared to the Gadwall and Mallard swimming next to it and had a green speculum when the sun caught it just right; it also had a mottled or speckled appearance on the breast and belly above the water. - Bob Myers
- Common Pintail	1	2/14/81	Cedar River in Cedar Falls unusual for the time of year - Bob Myers
Northern Harrier	2	1/24/81	Sweet Marsh - Bob Myers
Sharp-shinned Hawk	1	1/1/81	Mark Sand Prairie N.W. of Cedar Falls; Bob Myers
- Snowy Owl	1	1/20/81	Downtown Waterloo; about a week later this bird was reported found frozen in the ice on the Cedar River and died at the Black Hawk Humane Society, possibly poisoned
- Long-eared Owl	1	1/24/81	Sweet Marsh - Bob Myers
- Short-eared Owl	1	1/24/81	Sweet Marsh - Bob Myers
- Horned Lark			Very erratic and not plentiful throughout most of the period
- Winter Wren	1	12/13/80	University of Northern Iowa Biology Reserve in Cedar Falls - Bob Myers
- American Robin	100+	2/8/81	Around Cedar Falls area; unusual concentrations

- Golden-Crowned Kinglet			Fairly common throughout the period
Cedar Waxwing			Large flocks started showing up around the first of February.
- Hoary Redpoll	1	12/27/80	This bird showed up about a week or two before the Christmas Count and stayed until about the end of January. See documentation for details. Bird was seen at 1727 Plymouth St., Waterloo
Common Redpoll	11	12/27/80	1727 Plymouth St., Waterloo; As high as 11 individuals were seen at this residence in Waterloo in late December and through January. Was seen along with Hoary Redpoll above, many observers from the Waterloo Audubon Society saw them.
- Red Crossbill	2	1/11/81	Byrns Park, Waterloo
	4	2/15/81	Farm pine planting about 8 mi S. of Waterloo
- White-winged Crossbill	6	1/1/81	Pershing Rd; Waterloo - Bob Myers, Joe Schaufenbuel, Russell Hays,
