A-D, The sight date corresponds with most Iowa sightings.

A-D, Well described birds, but seems like a large number.

A-D, Striped head pattern and decurved bill described by birders familiar with the two candidates. The number is amazing!

A-D, Description adequate to eliminate other likely possibilities. Observers experienced. This was a good spring for Whimbrel flocks: 2 flocks of 29 and 23 were reported in central-western Nebraska 16 and 18 May, neatly sandwiched the date of this report. Some 63% of Nebraska reports are in the short window of 10-24 May.
