

Notes on species not completely documented.

D.C. Count. - D. cr. Cormorants - present in area thru Dec. - seen on count day by Elton Faulk, Kelly McKay, Tom Kent, Tom Shores, Mike Neulon and Tom Staudt at Lock 14.

Hermit Thrush - closely observed - rusty tail, spotted breast. Clark Scott in Ill.

Bohemian Waxwings. - Present for 10 days at home of Margaret Milota in Davenport with Cedars. White on wing, rusty undertail coverts, large size and grayer plumage noted.

Pr-Camanche - Mouth Parakeet - Present all Fall in the area, seen by many observers, but on count day seen by Elton Faulk. Green back & tail, pale gray below, seen in Ill.

Field Sparrow - Clear breast, pink bill & eye ring obs. - seen by Elton Faulk in Ill.

Muscatine - Field Sparrows - One - pink bill & eye ring, seen by Clark Scott & Kelly McKay in Ill. One - unstreaked, plain breast, pink bill & distinct eye ring - seen by Pete Petersen in Iowa.

W. Henry Co. - Field Sparrows - One - pink bill, distinct eye ring, clear breast - seen in Ill. by Kelly McKay, Clark Scott & Pete Petersen. Eight seen in Iowa - with Tree Sparrows - pink bill, eye ring noted - Allan Hahn.

Clinton - wild Turkeys - large size, dark color, shape. Seen by Clark Scott, Don Graves & Brad Boyd in Ill.

As usual we used a C. Screech Owl call repeatedly during the day to call out small birds. Again we got several owls using this method, especially in Iowa City (3). On the Muscatine count we had 5 owls calling about 6:30 AM at one spot - 2 Screech, 2 Harned + 1 Harned. Just saw a Brown Nighthawk 1/2 block from the house - he wasn't even the st. period bird it was in N.W. Dan. Still have several Glaucous Gulls around - Lock 15. On Sat. we saw 34 eagles on the Yellowe - Sealink St.
