COMMENTS:

There was no disagreement in the Records Committee regarding this well described bird. It was suggested that a careful watch be made in order to determine if this bird may be nesting nearby if it reoccurs in 1984.

The opinions expressed here are based on the information available to the Committee and should not necessarily preclude an alternate interpretation by those who observed the bird firsthand.

Any action may be re-reviewed upon submission of additional evidence.

Bill + ann Barker Viewed through Bushnell 10x50 binoce RR#3, BOX 190 Davenport, Ja 52804 (319) 285-9425 Male House Finch - 6-17-83 in yard around feeder I-P unth 30 or so houses, with cultivated fields immediately adjacent on 2 sides.) Bird was first seen about 6:10 PM at Sunflower plenty of light, wind probably, 0-5 mph. Perched flew to a Maple true 40 from house. Stayed in and around yard until 7PM, flying between the maple, a fence rail 35' away, and a Bradford Pear tree 20' away, and the feeder or the beach below it. Seemed quete shy - even moveso than House Spairows. Began singing and Continued periodically for 1/2 hr. Long is furth like; second half of it is house, remenescent of yellow-the Tures of Scarlet Janages. Menally -Ended on a slightly downward inflection. Varied. appearance; Bright red on top part of head, breast and rump. Really a true red - more in the derection of orange than any Purple Finch for sun. Leferute From straking on sides. Dark eige, brown cheek. Finch type bill; upper mandible appeared very slightly darker than lower will at close range. Brown buck ; really a bulliant red rump. Wings I tail brown; didn't notice if tail was notched Lineral Impression - a finch, slightly larger than Goldfincher concurrently at Luder. a thinner or live puffy appearance than Purple Finch, with bughter, more olarge Med Color. Shape of head may be flatter than Purple Finch
