 Uniform light tan gull of same size or slightly larger than Herring Gull. No black on wing, body or tail. Bill light colored except for distal 1/4 which was black (upper + lower mandible). Eye dark. Bird first seen flying with Herring's below dam. Later found about the dam sitting on ice with 100 Herring's. Bird easily separated from Herring by light tan color and light primaries. Legs not seen.

8. Description of behavior: Flying + resting on ice
9. Habitat - general: Mississippi River, frozen except below dam + d small area about dam  
 specific: Iowa side of L + D 14

Iceland gull - size, black-tipped bill
