3. (63). Gelochelidon nilotica (Hasselq.): 'Gull-billed Tern. The Gull-billed Tern was included by J. A. Allen in his list (1870). Thomas Say reported the ''Marsh Tern'' (Sterna aranca Wilson) at Engineers' Cantonment in 1819-20, but perhaps referred to the Black Tern (Long's Exp.). The species is of southern distribution, but has been recorded from Illinois and Michigan.
