V, Possibly correct, but description is so sketchy that it is difficult to judge validity of this record. When observer cites Loggerhead shrike as similar species, he must be unfamiliar with one or both species. No optical equipment was used and no mention of when description was written.

V, Although possibly correct, I don't think observations such as this belong in the record book.

III, Very poor description but adequate to describe this conspicuously colored bird.

IV, Probably a correct ID but from the documentation I don't even know the subject is a bird. If ID was correct it may possibly have been an escapee to have been in SE Iowa.

III, Poor description but enough for such a distinctive bird the observer knew form the west.

V, Description is of a Magpie. However source of bird is questionable. No information on feather condition, tameness of bird, etc. Not a confirmed invasion year. I could believe it to be a wild bird if other evidnce of vagrants this winter.

III, Description is skimpy in the extreme, but then Magpies are distinctive. Besides, after this batch I'd give it a III just because it isn't a gull. Summary of Review of an Ornithologic Observation
