Dear Mr. Kent

I've decided to get my overly long report to you early.  
Weather: Cool, humid. First Killing frost was about a week late, letting all the late-planted corn mature, so we got a bumper crop of corn that's ~~worth~~ worth less than it cost to produce. No significant snow yet. Harvest is late due to humidity <sup>+ late planting</sup>.

The acorn crop doesn't exist + the honeysuckle berry crop is abundant, influencing appropriate birds. Hackberry's don't exist this fall either; a mite infested all the trees, + they lost their leaves early. Rough-leaved dogwood had ~~to~~ lots of berries. Multiflora rose crop patchy.

One characteristic of the year has been late reproduction, apparently making up for young lost in the very wet May + June. Downy Young of Blue-winged Teal, Wigeon, + Ruddy Duck were seen in August. Pheasants had quail + dove-sized young in September, + Pheasant, Quail, + Gray Partridge populations are all down. (Bishop, Richard, 1982, 1982 Hunting Prospects, Iowa Conservationist Vol. 41 #10 pp. 6-8). The Wildlife Rescue Team in Wahoo, Nebr. recieved young raccoons in early September + a litter of Bobcats in the middle of the month. I found a road killed ♀ opossum Sept. 6 with 3 flattened young, the size of small rats, ~~many~~.

What is my significant news? ① Red-billed Grebe migration peaks. ② Cinnamon Teal, if true. ③ Wigeon breeding record - sort of expected, but for South + east of usual range. ④ Merlins. ⑤ Decline in Pheasant, Quail, + Huns. ⑥ lots (relatively) of Golden-crowned Kinglets.

- ✓ Bobwhite population down 40% over the state, compared to 10-year mean (but much better than 1979).  
(Bishop, Richard. 1982. 1982 Hunting Prospects. Iowa Conservationist Vol. 41, #10, p. 6-8.)

- ★ ✓ Ring-necked Pheasant On Sept. 18 Dan Cain, game warden for Mills + Montgomery County, ~~said~~ Pheasants were down 75% on August surveys in Mills, Montgomery, Fremont, + Page counties, and down 50% ~~in~~ over the state as a whole. He mentioned seeing many late broods, quail size + smaller in early September. The ~~refuge~~ Conservation Commission reports them down 40%, perhaps considering the late broods, in the same reference mentioned under "Bobwhite" above.

Mr. Cain says he feels the bad winter did not kill many pheasants, though it may have decreased their fertility. He feels the critical factor in decreasing the population was the wet spring, which flooded some nests and killed the chicks as they ran about in wet grass.
