**Description:** 

Size: Medium-large dove, slightly smaller than a Rock Dove.

Shape: Fairly heavy-bodied and full-chested, more similar to a Rock Dove than a Mourning Dove. Bill: Dark blackish brown.

Eyes: Not noted.

Head: Grayish brown slightly darker on crown and nape than on chin and throat. Pale blue area around eye extending to lores. Single black mark extending from near throat passing below auricular to near nape.

Back: Grayish brown.

Rump: Grayish brown, darker than back.

Breast/Belly: Grayish brown, lighter than back.

Wings: Grayish brown, similar to back, flight feathers darker. Folded wing showed a narrow white area along the greater coverts. In flight, the white area was very prominent.

Tail: Dark grayish brown, outer 4? retrices with a broad white terminal band and a narrow black subterminal band. In flight, the tail was broadly rounded and the white and black bands were very noticeable.

Legs/Feet: Dark reddish fleshtone.

Vocalizations: None noted.

Behavior: Initially foraging on the road, when approached it flushed and flew into the nearby forested area.

Similar species and how eliminated: Rock Dove: Wing pattern, tail pattern, head pattern, rump color. Mourning Dove: Overall shape, tail shape and pattern, wing pattern. Zenaida Dove: Breast and belly color, wing pattern, tail shape and color, common sense.

Did anyone disagree or have reservations about identification: No.

Viewing Conditions: Scattered broken clouds, 20 yards (paced), Leica 10x42.
