Significance: 2nd latest, I am a great doubter of them: + Thouses in May (although Prey were late this year + I sav one on the 3nd).

Yes - 1 Hermit Thrush was seen May 11, 1995, at Peterson Pits Co. Area in Story Co.

Beth Proescholdt, Russ Widner, and I all had very good definitive looks at this Hermit Thrush. There was no doubt at all that we saw a Hermit Thrush.

I would estimate we saw the Thrush at least 15-20 seconds. It was 4'-5' off the ground near the trail we were on and probably around 15 yards away. It was a sunny day and we had very good looks at the Hermit Thrush.

(Mom and I love watching thrushes - they're very special! We spend lots of time watching thrushes in migration and have thom down well.)

As I recall, the thrush hopped up from the ground. It had a very rusty-red tail that was rustier than the color of the back of the thrush which was a dulker color than the rusty tail. Definitely a marked difference in coloration between the tail color and the back color. This made a (over)

5 Thrush species morning for us after seeing a Veerys, 2 Gray-cheeked thrushes, and 1 Swainson's Thrush at McFarland Co. Park nearby as well as hearing a wood thrush there.

And as I'm pretty sure that it did, it slowly lifted its rusty tail upward just as Hermit Thrushes do.
