Most of Fairfield's winter was mild, although we had a few ice storms--one on 20 Jan. The first completely ground covering snow of the year was on 9 Dec. Temperatures dipped below zero in Feb. Early morning low temperatures were as follows: 18 and 24 Feb.: - 5 degrees and 24 Feb.: - 3 degrees. Mid Feb. also brought heavy snow that covered the ground through the end of the season. Heavy snow fell Feb. 25. By 10 Jan. my yard feeders and suet were empty. Sunflower seed was on porch in feeding area from 1/14 until 1/17.
