BIRDS: VERIFYING DOCUMENTATION OF AN EXTRAORDINARY SIGHT RECORD.

1. Species hooded warbler 2. Number: 1(51)

3. Location wooded hillside n. of C. Rd 'F', just w of highway 218

4. Date: 5-27 5. Time Bird seen: ~8 AM to ~8:10 AM

6. Description of size, shape and color-pattern (describe in great detail all parts of the plumage, and beak and feet coloration, in addition, to the diagnostic characteristics, but include only what actually was seen in the field):

bill slender, <sup>eye</sup> bill + legs blackish. Upper parts dull yellowish - olive, as were wings + tail. Tail had light spots on distal part of rectrices. Under-parts: bright yellowish on lower throat + breast, lighter on belly + undertail coverts. Forehead + crown black, black extending down side of neck to upper throat, which was also black. Area, enclosed by black was bright yellow.

7. Description of voice, if heard: Five slurred notes, the 1st 3 higher, and a single unslurred note, lower in pitch than the 2 middle notes: seeewe seeewe

8. Description of behavior: singing in lower branches of tall oak; seeewe chwe chwe chee. Tone very loud + ringing. Cadence rather like magnolia, tone like Canada's.

specific: a wooded hillside, with mature oaks & shagbark hickories and a dense understory of 6'-10' high shrubs, and ferns.

general: above is part of a large tract of woodland that borders the N. shore of the Coralville Reservoir, separated from the reservoir by a road and a belt of second-growth woods. To the W. is an old farm, brushy grown-up pastures; to the N. is farmland.
