Others who saw bird: 2 other local birders, but I didn't catch their names

Description of bird: The bird was roughly the size of nearby Ring-billed Gulls. The most conspicuous feature of the bird was its bold wing pattern. The wing was mostly white with the outer primaries and a bar running the length of the inner wing being black. The mantle was light gray. The tail was also white with a black terminal band. The tail was slightly notched. The nape was white except for a dark smudge across the back of the neck, just above the wings. When the bird was perched, the legs and bill both looked dark. The bill was much shorter and slimmer than the bill of a Ring-billed Gull. The head was white with a dark spot about an inch behind the eye. The eye also looked dark. The underparts were pure white with no obviuos markings of any sort. While perched, the wingtips extended well beyond the tail, not just a little behind the tail as in a Ring-billed Gull.

Similar species and how eliminated: The wing pattern, dark bill and legs, tail pattern, and size eliminates all other gulls.

Viewing conditions and equipment: Viewing conditions were very good with the sky slightly overcast. Estimated viewing distance was 60-80 yards most of the time(I was looking down on the bird from on the dam). I used Nikon 8 x 23 binoculars and a Buschnell 20-45x spotting scope.

Previous experience with species: I had never seen a Black-legged Kittiwake before this sighting.
