IV, Probably correct, but not convincingly documented. There is so little detail in this documentation written up one hour and two hours after five minute and two minute observations. The only suggestive feature mentioned was "medium grey wingtips."

IV, Identification based on wing tip which is described as "medium grey, darkest appearing to trailing edge of wing." I need more than this. Eye is described as "dark eye not observed" and

below as "its dark eye."

IV, Very scanty description, hard to read and follow observers thoughts and what he wanted to get across to reader of documentation. Not enough information to make a conclusive decision on Thayer's Gull. A better description could change my decision however (a more indepth study is required).

IV, Not convincingly separated from Kumlein's Iceland Gull. abstain, Also seen by T. Dwyer and G. White of Muscatine.

IV, Either a Thayer's or Kumlein's. In my opinion, latter not convincingly eliminated. "Wingtips not black" raises doubt about Thayer's. Not a very detailed sighting.
