Dear Mr. Kent

Last fall every one from Woolly Bear caterpillars to the 90-day weather forecast predicted a cold, snowy winter. While ~~some~~ everyone predicted ~~that~~ ^{the} winter, ^{before,} the real thing turned out mild + open. The ground didn't freeze until into January, there were only two bad storms. An ice storm Dec. 27th followed by snow + stressed birds. I doubt there was ~~so~~ much mortality; the birds were in good condition. A second storm Feb. 1 left 6" of snow + was followed by another 2" a couple days later. It drove larks to the roads to feed.

Duck migration is confusing. Mild weather encouraged them to stay. At Iowa Power + Light's Settling ponds at the south edge of Council Bluffs, the water didn't freeze until late January or the start of February. This kept fall ducks very late. (Birders in Bellevue will probably send more records on these ducks). Then in mid-February the thaw began here, + soon the ducks returned. They didn't quite spend all winter here, but you'd hardly notice it. (Feb. 10 the Settling ponds were frozen + no ducks present.)

Omaha birders are hosting many unlikely sparrows - several Lincoln's, White-throats + White-crowns, + a Field + even a couple winter Chippies. (at bird feeders)

Mild weather dominates the reports that follow.
