This is a northern species, ranging south in winter to northern

United States. It was listed by Allen (White's Geol. of Iowa, 1870, ii, p. 424), and given by Cooke as "occurring in winter in Minnesota, Wisconsin and Iowa'' (Bird Migr. in Miss. Val., 1884-85, p. 121). It has been reported from Illinois-at Kenilworth, December 26, 1902 (Deane, Auk, xx, :903), and Rockford, October 15, 1884 (O. & O., x, 1885).

G. H. Berry reports the species as a rare winter visitant in Linn county, and M. P. Somes as rare in Webster county. No specimens have been taken, however.

Cryptoglaux funerea richardsoni (Bonaparte). Richardson's Owl This species was placed in the hypothetical list by Anderson (1907). He stated that it had been reported from Linn and Webster countics, but that no specimens had been taken.
