Thomas Say reported the "Marsh Tern" (Sterna aranca Wilson) at Engineers' Cantonment in 1819-20, but perhaps referred to the Black Tern (Long's Exp.). The species is of southern distribution, but has been recorded from Illinois and Michigan.
