Only two people participated in the formal Smith's Long spur survey this year + reported results. Fields were checked 24 times in Boone, Appanoose, and Johnson Counties, from Feb. 5 through april 25. Horned Larks, Meadowlorks, and Lapland Longspors were found frequently. On estimated 100 Smith's Longspurs were found in a flat, dry cornfield 5 miles west of Center ville. These birds were Leeding mostly in the grass endrows by the fence. Seventeen were seen closely, and identified by the junco-like tail pattern, white shoulder patch, were using the field that day as well.
