NA, I believe that this record is probably correct based on date and striking black and white pattern. I suspect Pearl meant upper parts rather than back. Although she says the tail did not have a black tip, this mark could have easily been missed as the bird flew by. Unfortunately, the notes are not detailed enough to go beyond probable. /thk

(DH). A good case is made for a Sabine's Gull seen at Clear Lake (PK). There are reports of Caspian Terns: Sandy Beach on 19 September (LS), from 2 to 16 seen for 2 weeks at Rock Creek (MS), 2 at Cardinal Marsh on 27 September (DK), 40 on 26 September and 2 on 9 October (GB).

Dear Pearl.

Last week Eugene and Eloise Armstrong identified a juvenile Sabine's Gull at Saylorville Reservoir, and many of us got to see it. This prompted me to review again the lowa records of this species. There are three specimens from the 1800s, a reference in Iowa Bird Life to your seeing one at Clear Lake in 1970, and a reference to one in western lowa which Jim Dinsmore just found in the Nebraska Bird Review.

My research shows 2 to 8 reports of this species, mostly juveniles, from midcontinent (Canada to Texas) each fall since 1960 with equal numbers in September and October and a few in November and December. Thus I had been expecting another lowa report sooner or later, but not from mid-November.

Woody Brown's comment on your sighting in the Field Reports of lowa Bird Life (volume 41, page 47) reads as follows: "A good case is made for a Sabine's Gull seen at Clear Lake (PK)."

I thought I might have your original report when I recently acquired some old files, but they only go back to 1971.

At any rate, I was wondering if you still have notes on this sighting and/or can provide additional information. Particularly useful would be the date, exact location, whether a juvenile or adult, and any description of the bird that remains in your notes or mind.

I'm hoping all of the information on this species in lowa can be pulled together so that it can be included in the December issue of lowa Bird Life.

It is good to get reports from you from time to time. Tom Staudt tells me of your helping him with the Christmas Bird Count at Marble Rock.
