Also mention voice and behavior. Noted a warbler quite similar to a fall immature Bay-breasted or Blackpoll, except that throat and upper breast showed more yellow. After seeing this, looked carefully at back, which was a uniform unstreaked gray-green. Also noted, conspicuous wingbars, white undertail coverts. At the sides of the breast there were distinct if faint markings like rudimentary streaks. I noticed these on a couple of occasions while watching the bird. As suggested above, throat and upper breast were a medium yellow. No sounds were noted. Bird very actively flitted about the treetop (large oak) with other warblers.
Additional note: The streaking along the sides of the breast were along a very short section of the upper breast only.
Similar species; how eliminated: Saw a couple of Yellow-throated Vireos the same morning. Subject bird was different in general appearance and behavior than any vireo. Yellow-throated Vireo does not have the vague streaking along sides of breast.
Did any one disagree or have reservations about the identification? No
Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), optical equipment. Sky overcast. Distance about 50ft. (guess). 10x40 XRXXX Zeiss binocs.
Previous experience with species and similar ones: First for Iowa. Saw last spring in Texas.
