

DETAILS FOR UNUSUAL BIRD SIGHTING

SPECIES: NASHVILLE WARBLER

LOCATION: Suburban backyard north of Iowa City

DATE: 2 November, 1991 Approximately 1:10PM off and on for 10 minutes

OBSERVER: Jim Fuller, 6 Longview Knoll, NE, Iowa City, Iowa, 52240

BACKGROUND: All the above birders were having lunch at my house, and watching birds at the feeders and on the river, when Tim Schantz exclaimed that he had just seen a Nashville warbler. It was in a green vine around the base of the picture window we were all looking out (3-4 feet away). It hopped around in the foilage pecking at the leaves.

DESCRIPTION: The following features were noted on this warbler like bird. The back was a grayish-green color. The breast and throat were a bright yellow. The head was gray, with a noticeable white eye ring.
