I saw the side view of a thrush like bird that was standing on the ground. It was a little larger than a Northern Cardinal that was near-by but I would say smaller than a Robin. The back was a brownish-gray; the wings had orange wing-bars and orange spots on the primaries. There was an orange eyebrow and a dark straight bill. When the bird turned to face me, I noted a bright orange upper breast and neck, a gray band( aprox. 3/8" wide) across the breast. The lower breast was about the color of orange on a Robin breast. The bird was foraging in the leaves, tossing them aside with it's bill. I then went to the house of Bill & Kathy La Frinz where we watched the bird forage around the perimeter of the yard and noted all of the above features and habits.
