I did not realize this was a late date until a week or two after the sighting so I didn't make field notes, or even spend much time looking at the bird.
The bird was among a loose troupe of other Warblers, perhaps 10 feet off the ground. I noted the general brown colorit reminds me of the color of a House Wrenand then was able to see the black and buff striped crown. From this I was able to positively identify it as a Worm-eating Warbler. The bird was Warbler-sized, and had the same profile and posture as other Worm-eating Warblers I had seen recently.
I realize this isn't much of a description, but I have become very familier with this species over the summer. Assuming one gets a good look at the crown(which I did) it is, in my opinion, as distinctive and unmistakable as any bird in Iowa.
Similar species and how eliminated: Conspicuous striped crown ruled out other Warblers.  General shape and posture wrong for striped-crown sparrows.
