before I forgot.

Location - 2 miles north of Wapello in Louisa County. Date - late June and July 1983 seen on numerous occaisions. Habitat - along edge of timber, at the top of the Iowa River bluff. Lawns and crop ground extend right to the edge of the bluff, with timber down to the river, Description - A pair of House Wrens were using a birdhouse on our clothesline, and I kept close tabs on them from our Kitchen window. One day I noticed a wren that appeared to have more white on it so I checked it out with binoculars. The white eye stripe and white underparts were obvious, and a little closer scruting revealed his white-fringed tail which he was flicking from side to side, just like the book says. I never saw more than one at ... a time, but saw one on numerous occassions after that, I usually saw it right around a swingset in our neighbors yard and once saw it go into a hole in one of those plastic horses that swings, I never did hear it sing or see any nesting evidence.
