The bird was first heard singing a series of high, rapid buzzy notes, repeated about every half minute. Size - small, about 5-6" long Back was dark, olive-green color with several distinct marson streaks on apper back. Sunderparts a uniform bright fyellow, except for some black streaking on sides. Head - olive-green on top, yellow throat black face with a yellow cheek patch and a distinct yellow streak over eye. The bird fläcked it's tail continuously during the viewing period.

Similar species and how eliminated: other warblers by combination of call, black streaking on sides, distinctive facial pattern, and marcon streaking on back.
