Description of bird: I first noticed the bird because of its repeated buzzy call which sounded like a hoarse Cedar Waxwing. I finally found the bird perched in a tree with three Cedar Waxwings. The bird was larger, had a longer crest, reddish undertail coverts, a black chin, a rusty face, a grayish back and underparts, a white wing spot, and some red and yellow color on the wingtips. The bird was also slightly larger than the Cedar Waxwings.

Similar species and how eliminated: Cedar Waxwing eliminated by call, size, grayer coloration, and rusty undertail coverts.

Viewing conditions and equipment: Viewing conditions were excellent with the sun behind me and the sky cloudy.

Previous experience with species: I have seen about a dozen Bohemian Waxwings in Iowa.
