6. Slim graceful body about size of catbird. Bill straight and dark and of medium proportions-flycatcher type. Underside and breast and throat whitish. Head, face and back a uniform gray color. Wings black and long mainly black tail feathers. White outer edging on tail and tail as long again as the body itself. When bird flew or raised its wings, crimson or pale scarlet wing linings very prominent. Tail forked deeply into two feather when bird flew or shifted position onperch.
