The face, throat, and upper breast and flanks were a bright orangish-yellow. A brownish car patch was noted. The breast + flanks had fine streaking. The hope of neck was gray - unstreaked. Back was darker brown with 4 white stripes. Bolly was white.

Similar species and how eliminated: Dark crown with no light central streak eliminates the Le Conte's Sponrow as does the larger size and somewhat darken color. Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification? NO
