

Female Summer Tanager  
South edge of Mason City

May 4 & 5, 1989

Evelyn Zack of Mason City reported an unusual bird eating blue berries (thrown out from her freezer) on her lawn. She called Jan Walter and also me. I noted the following points. The bird was smaller and slimmer than a robin. The wings and back were a nearly uniform brownish olive color. Underparts were a paler, more yellowish color. The bird did not appear greenish at all. The bill was large and much stouter than the bill of an oriole. It was pale colored. I observed the bird from 10:00 AM to Noon. The light was good and the bird was approximately 50-75 feet away.

I consulted Nat'l Geographic, Audubon Soc. Master Guide to Birding & Kenn Kaufman's Notes on Female Tanagers in American Birds Vol. 42 No. 1 (Spring of 1988) before becoming convinced the bird was a female Summer Tanager.
