Description of bird(s): I was driving along road when several juncos and a larger, browner bird flushed from alongside the road. In the quick glimpse I got of the bird, I noticed it had white outer tail feathers. I turned around and quickly found the bird again along the road edge.

The bird was obviously a sparrow because of the size, general shape, and brown color. The underparts were heavily streaked, especially on the upper breast and flanks, and gradually faded to a white, unmarked lower belly. The tail was also brown, except for white outer tail feathers. The wings were brown as well and showed a clear white wing bar. The legs were pink. Bill appeared dark. Eye was dark, and was surrounded by a very bold white eye ring. Throughout the observation, the bird hopped around in the gravel along the road's edge with several Dark-eyed Juncos.

Optical equipment and viewing conditions: Viewing was in excellent light, and I easily got within 30 feet of the bird. I used Bausch and Lomb 7x35 binoculars.

Previous experience with species: I am very familiar with Vesper Sparrows as they are common breeders in Iowa. I am also familiar with other sparrows that occur in Iowa.
