Also mention voice and behavior.  About three seconds after getting out of my car for the lime Creek field trip, I heard a clear chil-ick' come from the field by the parking lot. I paused, and heard it again a few seconds later. I summoned Mark Proes@holdt (whom I knew the song(call?)
of the Henslow's Sparrow) who then heard it. We then spotted the singing bird, and with the aid of Jim Sinclair, confirmed the identification as a Henslow's Sparrow. Features initially noted included the short size and tail which was similar to a Grasshopper Sparrow, the flat-headed appearance, and the conspicuously stripped crown.
Although I did not make field notes, I did note the buffy, broad breast band, streaked breast, whitish throat, and greenish tint about cheeks.  Overall, the bird(s) was quite cooperative, singing from exposed perches, which involved the top of dead weeds.
Similar species; how eliminated: Grasshopper Sparrow has much different song, and no trace of greenish about head.
Did any one disagree or have reservations about the identification? No If yes, explain:
Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), optical equipment.  Lighting excellent. Distance 50' to 100' (estimate. I used 10x binocs plus various spotting scopes.
