They were Too Thin for & porple finishes and lacked any trace of a white eyeline. They too streaked to be indigo buntings (wrong color as well). I thought of possible pine siskins but There was no yellow visible on wings (bars of any color were not noted), The bill was short and start-not as thin as siskin , and "U" notch. The Tail did not show deep notch in Termino (end - had fairly shallow "U" notch. Basically Thru process of elimination I concluded these must be
