large sparrow, built like a white-crown but larger, longer-tailed, posture less erect.

creep, front of face, upper chest black; chest patch with irregular lower border. lower chest light brownish.

face light brown, with a faint eye stripe; bill pink.

mape, upper parts, wings, tail dark brown; upper parts were streaked with darker blackish-brown; 2 very faint wing-bars.

light: sunny day; sun originally behind bird but we worked around + got good obs. with the light behind us.

optics 8x40 binocs.

habitat: woodlot with tall trees, weed patches, brush pile, in an area of fields and second-growth woods.

actions: hopping around in brushpile, eating buds in maple tree.

voice: began with three high-pitched wavering whistles, each rather like a white-throat's, followed by 2 buzzes on a lower pitch:
