WHILE DRIVING A GRAVEL ROAD NORTH OF BURLINGTON ON THE CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT, A SPARROW-LIKE BIRD FLEW FROM THE ROAD TO A FENCE, AND LATER INTO THE ROAD WHERE WE WATCHED IT FOR 5 MINUTES. IN FLIGHT, IT HAD DISTINCTIVE WHITE OUTER TAIL FEATHERS, WHICH WERE ALSO VISIBLE AT TIMES ON THE STANDING BIRD. THE BIRD WAS RATHER LIGHT IN GENERAL COLOR AND ABOUT THE SIZE OF A HOUSE SPARROW. THE BIRD HAD A PROMINENT WHITE EYE RING. THE BACK, CROWN AND WINGS FOLDED WERE BROWN STREAKED AND THE FLANKS HAD PROMINENT STREAKING. HOWEVER THE THROAT AND BREAST WERE WHITE AND UNSTREAKED. NO CHESTNUT WING PATCH COULD BE SEEN - EVEN THOUGH IT WOULD BE A NORMAL FIELD MARK. BOTH LEGS AND BILL WERE LIGHT - LEGS GRAY-PINK AND BILL LIGHT GRAY.

Similar species and how eliminated: Song Sparrow - NO BREAST SPOT ON THIS BIRD AND VESPER HAS LESS BREAST STREAKING & ALSO WHITE OUTER TAIL FEATHERS. SAVANNAH SPARROW DOES NOT HAVE AS PROMINENT EYE RING AND NO WHITE OUTER TAIL FEATHERS.
