Description of bird:Both birds were sparrow-sized birds with large bills and streaked underparts. The back, tail, and face were brown and unstreaked. Both birds lacked the face pattern typical of female Purple Finches. The underparts were lighter brown and streaked. This streaking also included the undertail coverts.

Similar species and how eliminated: The lack of a facial pattern eliminated a female Purple Finch.

Viewing conditions and equipment: Viewing conditions were good with the sun behind me. Estimated viewing distance was 30-40 feet. I used Nikon 8 x 23 binoculars.

Previous experience with species: I have seen many House Finches in Massachusetts and three in Iowa.
