The bird also had a flatter crown than the other grachles. Color - bird was all black in color including body, bill, and legs. The light was not right for me to beable to see the glossy colors on ito body. Paring the viewing period, the bird made several short flights to other mudflats. The birds unappeats were noticeably slower than the other blackbirds, more reminiscent of a crow than a blackbird. Similar species and how eliminated:

Eliminated from Common Grochle by larger 5170 (tuke the 5180 of other nearby gradules), longer tail and flatter crown. Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification?
