RED BELLIED WOODPECKER - 1000 SEEN

GREBES - PIED BILLED COMMON, NO OTHERS SEEN.

PELICANS - ONLY A FEW SMALL FLOCKS SEEN. (I USUALLY SEE MANY MORE)

CORMORANTS - NONE SEEN

HERONS - GREAT BLUE - LAST SEEN IN THE CHEROKEE AREA ON NOV. 7TH

GREEN - COMMON ALONG THE LITTLE SIOUX RIVER IN MY AREA.

LAST SEEN ON Sept 23RD.

Geese - CANADAS SEEN FREQUENTLY

SNOW - ABUNDANT FLYING HIGH ON NOV 28TH I OBSERVED ABOUT 75,000 AT DESOTO GEND REFUGE.

DUCKS - VERY GOOD MIGRATION DUE TO WET CONDITIONS

WOOD DUCK - 250+ ON AN EIGHT MILE STRETCH OF THE LITTLE SIOUX RIVER BY CHEROKEE ON OCT 29TH.

MALLARD - EXTREMELY ABUNDANT ON THE LARGE LAKES OF NORTHWEST IOWA. THEY ARE STILL HERE AT THIS WRITING.

HAWKS - ACCIPITERS ~~came~~ through here THE LAST OF Sept THRU THE FIRST WEEK OF OCT. NOT MANY SEEN. 8 SHARPSHINNED AND 1 COOPER'S

REDTAIL - ON OCT 6TH I COUNTED 49 REDTAILS, (ALL COLOR PHASES,) IN MIGRATION ALONG THE LITTLE SIOUX RIVER THE BEST DAYS COUNT I'VE EVER HAD.

BROADWING - NONE SEEN.

SWAINSON - NONE SEEN.

HAWKS (CONT) ROUGH LEG - FIRST ONE SEEN OCT 20TH NORTH OF CHEROKEE. I'VE SEEN ONE OR 2 A WEEK SINCE.

BALD EAGLE - A FEW MIGRATE ALONG THE LITTLE SNAKE RIVER.

MOST OBSERVED ARE IMMATURE. LAST ONE OBSERVED WAS ON NOV 25TH. I SAW A TOTAL OF 4 THIS FALL WITH ONLY 1 BEING MATURE AND A YOUNG.

MARSH HAWK - I SAW A COUPLE EARLY. NONE LATELY. I DIDN'T SEE AS MANY AS USUALLY. ONLY 7 SEEN THIS FALL.

AT 5,000 FT. WILDERNESS - HARD TO FIND.

KESTREL - ALMOST ABUNDANT DURING MIGRATION AROUND FIRST OF OCTOBER. HARD TO FIND NOW.

Bobwhite - HARD TO FIND.

PHEASANT - DOING WELL. VERY LATE CORN HARVEST SHOULD SEE MORE COCKS NEXT SPRING.

Gray Partridge - DOING VERY WELL.

SANDPIPER & PLOVER - NOT ENOUGH SEEN TO MAKE A COMMENT.

OTHER THAN KILLDEER ARE COMMON.

GRASSHOPPER SWARM - AWAY FROM TOWN.

GULLS - 4 FRANKLINS GULLS ON NOV 10TH SEEMED LATE.

WATER TERRNS - NOT SEEN.

WOODPECKERS - RED HEADED WERE VERY NUMEROUS THIS FALL. THERE

ARE STILL A FEW AROUND.

THRUSHES - Bluebird - I had 18 successful nesting in my boxes. However this is only ~~3~~ 66% of the success I had last year. I saw 25 on Oct 14th

GOLDEN GROUNDED KINGLETS - I saw my first ones this fall that I have seen in 2 years. I saw 2 on Oct 27th.

CEDAR WAXWINGS - Present in small flocks.

SHRIKES - Few seen.

PINE SISKINS - 13 on Oct 14th are all I've seen.

I have seen no winter finches yet.

* I saw 5 LeConte's sparrows in Sioux County on Oct 11th.
