They were viewed at about 50 yds with 15x45 scope. I can erron & if it is of your opinion please disregard.

Winter birds are coming in abundance, large flock of 1000+ of Junco & Lapland longspurs are seen, 7 snow buntings, 2 Evening grosbeaks,

I have 2 Red headed woodpeckers at my feeder daily.
