Osprey 1 flying over Ames on 22 August JDinsmore

Sanderling 8 seen at Saylorville Res on 2 October J Dinsmore

Franklin's Gull 1 still at Saylorville Res on 25 November was late seen well and compared with Bonaparte's Gulls J Dinsmore

Sabine's Gull-1 seen at Saylorville Res on 11 November, see attached documentation J Dinsmore

Chimney Swift several were staying late in Ames 3 seen on 14 October and 1 still present on 15 October, also two seen in Des Moines on 14 October J Dinsmore

- Blue Jay good numbers migrating south along the loess hills on 28 September saw one flock of ca 40 and almost a steady stream of other smaller groups
- American Crow--the "Ames" roost had started to form by late Sep with 215 counted as early as 25 September J Dinsmore

Brewer's Blackbird-flock of 100 seen near Saylorville Res on 11 November (with Joe Schaufenbuel) J Dinsmore

Birds reported to me by others

Common Loon--1 in winter plumage seen at Big Creek Lake in early August by Tim Huisman

Ross' Goose--several seen at DeSoto NWR on 20 November by Erv Klaas (he has been studying Snow Geese there for a number of years)

Northern Goshawk--one adult seen at Ames on 20 November by John Mayfield (in Dept of Zoology, an active birder here in Ames)

Broad-winged Hawk--600 seen along bluffs near Forney Lake on 2 October by Don Priebe, ICC biologist for that part of Iowa

Lesser Golden-Plover--3 seen in corn stubble field near DeSoto NWR on 12 Nov by Erv Klaas (he said he saw them well)

Scissor-tailed Flycatcher--one seen in Ames on 31 August by Phillip Mulder (see attached documentation) (Mulder is grad student in Entomology)
