Dear fellow birder:

An informal committee has met and is offering the following as a working proposal for an lowa Birdline. Now we need help from a larmer sample. Your name was chosen because you are a frequent contributor to the Field Reports.

The line probably would work as follows: A single phone line, likely to be located in Iowa City, will be connected to a telephone answering machine. When the number is dialed, the machine will play a message and then allow for listener input. The following items have been suggested for inclusion on the line:

- 1. Rare birds: including directions for finding the bird.
- 2. Birding events: Christmas counts, conventions, etc.
- 3. Misrant arrival dates and unusual nestings.

The tage will be updated at least weekly during the less exciting seasons, and more often during migration. The system as proposed would cost around \$500 for the first year and \$300 in the following years. This would cover the cost of a business telephone line and purchase or rental of the answering machine.

We propose to finance this through donations. These would be given to the IOU (therefore tax deductible) but earmarked for the Birdline. The system would not be set up until one year's operating costs were in hand.
