In addition I have seen numerous cattle egrets and little blue herons throughout the Missouri River bottoms in Mills and Fremont Counties. The cattle egrets have initiated a rookery at the Fulsom Lake Area in Mills County. As of 7-20-84 many of the eggs had hatched. There were also a few little blue heron nests in the same willow thicket.

You will probably be receiving a more detailed report concerning the nesting cattle egrets and little blue herons.
Ross Silcock has been watching them closely and has attempted to count the nests. In addition I have shown the colony to Dave Newhouse and Doug Reeves.
