G.B. Heron - the colony along the river south of the Soyloville dam did not do well, despite attempts. Corp construction of the nearby bike trail, followed by noons were damaging.

In early July one (left a nest and) I could see no young. Many herons in town, though (23 nests in '84).
Y.C. Night heron - their usual habitat was dry all summer - not seen
Canada goose - at least ^{one} pair raised young (at Big Creek)
and 2 more were in the Soyloville area all summer

Wood duck - one young fairly observed. Many nest boxes around the lake
Mallard - several pairs summered; young on 7/29 (6)

* Ring-neck duck - a male spent 5-26 to 7/29 on a farm pond
north of the lake; as of 7/29, no others seen

Turkey vulture - present all summer, up to nine at one time

* Looper hawk - at least 2 fledged, 6/29, heavy woods, west side of Soyloville
gray partridge - 3 flushed 6/1, near the shooting range, east side of
Soyloville, ? the furthest south for this species?

Spotted sandpiper - only 2 pairs down from previous year
woodcock - total of 5 in courtship flight March-April; between Brook camp area
Foster's farm - 6 observed 7/20

Black turn - 2 observed 7/20

Cinnamon turn - 1 observed 7/7, 3 on 7/20

R.B. Gull - 3 observed 7/20

Y.B. Larkoo - common

B.B. Larkoo - not seen

G.H. Owl - nest = 2 young 4/2), Soyloville; another pair $\frac{1}{2}$ mi

Barned Owl ^{an old nest not found} - 1 pair present throughout early summer & spring (Mar.-Apr.-May)
Whip-poor-will - one calling, Soyloville, some spot x 4 summers

R.T. Hummingbird - regular, vicinity of Soyloville (western)

Hairy Woodpecker - 2 pair - Foster Park, Soyloville

Pileated Woodpecker - 1 observed, June 32, wood location below dam
Wood Pewee - common

Phoebe - one in Fisher Park, nest not found

Willow Flycatcher - common in shelterbelts, Big Creek

Purple Martin - 2 houses

Tiny Swallow - pair in 3 locations, Sycamore

R.W. Swallow - along on river, below Sycamore

Barn Swallow - 2 pairs, 2 Sycamore locations

Cliff Swallow - 2 colonies, Dam, & bridge below dam, Sycamore

Marsh Wren - 6 singing, upland locations, Big Creek, Sycamore

Bluebird - at least 3 locations

* Veery - singing 6/29, heavy woods, West side Sycamore

Wood Thrush - 7 singing .. "

White-eyed Vireo - not found this summer

* Bell's Vireo - common in shelterbelts, Big Creek (6 males in 6' belts)

V.T. Vireo - 2 pairs, Fisher & Sycamore

Warbling Vireo - common in Fisher park, scattered other Sycamore locations

* Cerulean Warbler - 4 singing, heavy woods, west side of Sycamore 6/29

Prothonotary Warbler - 1 pair in elk pen (oxbow) at Fisher, 1 pair

Kentucky Warbler - near heron colony not found this summer

Dawn bird - 13 singing in a $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile stretch, heavy wood
west side of Sycamore 6/29

Juncos winterbrush - not found when they raised a brood last
year

Southern Tanager - 2 pairs in Fisher, 4 pairs west side of Sycamore

Indigo sparrow - 1 pair with at least 2 fledglings on a sandy
east shore of Sycamore 6/7

grasshopper sparrow - common in prairie restoration area along
bike trail east of Soyfornills 7/26; in May, along lower
Bobolink - 2 pair, north of Big Creek, between shelterbelts
orchard and 1 immature, .. , in shelterbelt, 6/7
