

			Commerical Street in Keokuk. Draws from staging areas in Iowa, Missouri, and one of some 15,000 birds across the river in Ill. Ill. birds are easily visible from Keokuk and I took my time with the count. Estimates of Ill. and Mo. Mo. and Ia. contributions very conservative. At sunset, this is quite a spectacle.
