We were helping band snow geese (blue & white phase) on Nov. 21, at DeSoto National wildlife refuge with Dr. Klass of Iowa State University, when Dr. Klass identified a Ross' goose (im.) It was much smaller than the snows and weighted between 3.2 and 3.5 lb. where as the snows weighed between 4.5-5 lb. It was photographed and set free (unbanded). The method of capture was a baited trap and the capture was at approximately 2:30 pm.
