Never had much build up in numbers of any species although fair numbers of Northern Shovelers around until at least 17 April

Divers pretty much ditto on above - no real big numbers or concentration although Common Mergansers were fairly numerous on Little Wall Lake, Hamilton Co. week of 12-18 March; very few Buffleheads and only one Common Goldeneye (15 March) reported

One pair of Hooded Mergansers in mouth of Paint Creek, Allamakee Co - were they nesters?? Also saw a few others in migration

In general it seemed to be a poor year for warblers. Didn't see much in way of big waves and many species seemed less common than usual.
