

Summer Bird Report 1977 by Black  
Red Rock and Pleasant Grove Twp.

Great Blue Herons - began nesting in in late June.  
a dozen seen.

Green Heron - 1 seen at Lake, lumping.  
seen in Lucas County, Coloma area

Mallard - a few seen on L. Red Rock all summer  
but had no nesting reports as in previous years

Turkey Vulture - Summer (non-breeders) flocks of  
20 to 30 roosting on Elk Rock and  
Red Rock Bluff. No nesting known.

Red-Tailed Hawks - 9 pairs in Pleasant Grove Twp  
and far edge of Warren County.  
2 nests failed and 1 successful.  
Others not located.

Amer. Kestrel - 4 none seen all summer  
(once had 6 pairs in this area)

Kildeer - scarce except around Lake.

Woodcock - 1 pair and 4 chicks seen W. of Pville

Forster's Terns - 11 seen last 2 weeks of July, Lake R.R.

Black Terns - flock of 25 seen on July 18 " "

Yellow-billed Cuckoos - very scarce

Black - " " - none seen

Screech Owls - 1 nested successfully here in town.

Whip-poor-will - heard in wooded bluffs around

R.R. Refuge at several places.

Night Hawks - Scarce, 1 pair here on Pville  
seen in Red Rock area.

Chimney Swift - a few in my neighbor's fire  
place chimney. Scarce with most  
chimneys blocked.

Ruby-throated Hummingbird - 2 at feeders here in town  
2 at syrup 5 miles north of town. I saw  
none on field trips

Red-headed Woodpecker - Numerous all over this  
area.

Hairy - Seldom see one.

Eastern Kingbird - fairly numerous.

2) Western Kingbird - 1 in Weed & es Maene  
~~1 pair in Ankeny~~ - nestings  
in both these areas reported 1975 & 1976

Eastern Phoebe - had 4 reports from over the state.  
Had 3 pairs only in Pville, Red Rock area

1 pair nested in a garage near Russell, Lucas County

Barn Swallows - Many seen near farm buildings.

Cliff Swallows - flock nested on Red Rock dam

also under 1 small bridge on old 14.

The nests on west side of Mile Long Bridge  
all fail, made of soil that would not hold together  
nesting on 1 natural cliff, Painted Rocks  
within Red Rock Refuge.

Purple Martins - no houses filled, down in  
numbers. Fewer in each house.

Mockingbirds - None all summers in fields  
where they have nested for past 20 years.

Eastern Bluebirds - Scarce, only 2 pairs seen.

1 pairs at Felsungs near RR dam

1 pair in No. Elk Rock State Park

Cedar Waxwings - 1 pair nested in Pville,  
(which is uncommon here.)

Loggerhead Shrikes - 3 pairs nested SE of town

1 pair reported near Bedford Ia.

Donald Gillapsey reported about 1 pair every

5 to 7 miles in the Lamoni (Decatur Co) area

Red eyed Vireos - few

Bell's Vireo - 1 singing in old pasture SE of Pville

but never located the nest!

Common Yellowthroat = fairly common.

Yellow-breasted Chat - None in areas where

at least 2 pairs once nested.

Amer. Redstart - None seen or heard.

Yellow Warbler - 1 nest, 4 young there.

Bobolinks - None in the big field where they

were nested for years. Grass sparse, drought.

4 pairs in No. Elk Rock Park grass field

but they left after field was mowed unnecessarily.

- Red Rock & El. Grove Turp, Summer '77 G Black
- 3) Red winged Blackbirds - most numerous nester here
- Orchard Oriole - 1 pair nested SE of Pville.
- I first year male in No. E Elk Rock State Park during nesting season.
- Northern Mock - my impression is that they are down from a few years ago,
- Brown-headed Cowbird - too numerous
- Rosebreasted Grosbeak - good numbers altho fewer at the Elmwood woods near Red Rock than in 1976  
5 pairs along a mile stretch of Rock Island R.R.  
also along C B & G SE of Pville,  
and in North Elk Rock State Park.
- Indigo Bunting - fairly numerous and still singing madly.
- Cicada - 2nd most numerous nester but I have seen higher populations in past years.
- Amer. Goldfinches - numerous.
- Grasshopper Sparrows - rare  
Donald Bellaprey reports several near Lamoni
- Refugee - seen Tawhee - a pair here & there in suitable habitat which is scarce in this area.  
1 pair west of Pville, 1 pair NO. of Pville,  
1 pair in No. E Elk Rock State Park
- Chipping Sparrows - Numerous here in farm fields
- Field Sparrow - numerous in fields but fields of grass becoming rarer!
- Scarlet Tanager - only 1 pair located nesting 5 miles south of Pella in Marion County.  
at bird bath daily at country home.
- Upland Sandpipers - 1 pair nested at Lamoni, D Bellaprey  
1 pair at farm near Bedford. None here.
- 2 Bewicks Wrens reported in Forest City in April
- Hutton Warbler, Y. B. Cuckoo, Nighthawks reported from Laverda La (Marion County)
