7 Double-crested Cormorants (GB)

Every species of duck listed on IOU check list, except Cinnamon Teal and Oldsquaw. Very few canvasbacks

3 Cattle Egrets on a farm on north side of lake for 10days through May 9. (GB)

1st Turkey Vultures returned around March 10.

As many as 11 Bald Eagles were sighted in early Mar. (GB) 5 stayed on until the last week in March.

1 Osprey in late March and 1 in mid-April.

Good Northern Harrier migration through the area beginning in Feb. and continuing through April. As many as 8 sighted in late March, and 2 sighted the 31st of May.

Small numbers of common Sandpipers, with 6 Wilson's Phalaropes on May 7.

A few Franklin's Gulls, Forster's Terns and 12 Caspian Terns in late April.

Phoebes are scarce, but a nest was recorded in Elk Rock State Park.

Grasshopper Sparrows in Roberts Creek Park.

Cliff Swallows have abandoned previous nesting sites and were having trouble building nests underneath mile long bride because of snady mud.
