Dear Dr. Halmi;

Following is my list of observations:

Sharp-shinned Hawk--1 on Dec 28 & 29 at Locust, Winneshiek Co., 1 on Dec 29 in Allamakee Co.

Red-tailed Hawk--Wintering in good numbers: 26/100 mi on Dec 24 and 22/100 mi (same route in Winneshiek & Allamkee Co's) on Feb 10. High of 38/100 mi in northern Allamakee Co. on Dec 29

Rough-legged Hawk--Many in Dec, somewhat fewer later

Golden Eagle -- 1 adult in Allamakee Co. on Dec 29 (documentation later)

Am. Kestrel--12 observed in Winneshiek and Allamakee Co's during period

Saw-whet Owl--1 at Brushy Creek (Webster Co.) on Feb 7

Red-headed Woodpecker--Not nearly as numerous as past winters, but 2-3 on each field trip

Tufted Titmouse -- 2-4 on each field trip

Eastern Bluebird--1 in Allamakee Co on Dec 27

Townsend's Solitaire--1 in Allamakee Co. on Dec 27 (later by Joe S. who will document)

Northern Shrike--4 in Winneshiek and Allamakee Co's (on 5 field trips) during period. (Too numerous in northeast to document; a study of of midwest CBC's suggests that 42 N be a valid dividing line betweem Northern and Loggerhead in winter)

Rusty Blackbird--5 near Harper's Ferry on Feb 10

Evening Grosbeak--Good numbers in Dec, 2 in YRF on Feb 10

Pine Grosbeak -- 10 in YRF on Dec 22, others with J.S. and on CBC

Common Redpoll -- abundant in northeast

Pine Siskin--common early Dec, but not later

White-winged Crossbill--common early Dec, but not later

Lapland Longspur--Common in northeast

Snow Bunting--abundant in northeast
