As you can see from the enclosed letter, Woody Brown considers the attached documentation for Steller's Jay, a new species to the Iowa list, sufficient for acceptance. I don't agree, and several people I showed the materials to share my skepticism. I told Woody I would send you the stuff, since I will report this very gingerly in my forthcoming IBL report unless somebody convinces me that it would be prudent to do otherwise.

We do have ² (possibly nesting) Say's Phoebe n.e. of Iowa City in Linn Co., well to the e. of any previous state record. I got back last week from a trip to Churchill, with a group led by Davis Finch. I reached and went past the magic number of 600 for the ABA area, with Glaucous Gull, Long-tailed Jaeger, Smith's Longspur, Willow Ptarmigan, Spruce Grouse and Baird's Sparrow in s.w. Manitoba (I have not been to Alaska). The way people are piling up Asian Stray on Atou and Gambell, maybe only 700 is a number of real distinction. I guess we'll have to yield to Cary Balch on that landmark, among the people in this area.
