- Golden Plover- est. 50 birds near Amana April 17-20
- Hudsonian Godwit- April 16-17 at Amana Lake 2 birds
- Marbled Godwit- May 23 Amana Lake 2 birds
- Upland Sandpiper- May 5 near Oxford
- Willet- May 10 Babcock Lake Road near Swan Lake
- ~~Buddy Sturnstone- May 23 at Amana Lake 4 birds~~ and May 24 at Amana Lake 6 birds *also TK*
- ~~Sanderling- May 29 at Amana Lake 3 birds~~
- Western Sandpiper- May 29 at Amana Lake
- White Rumped Sandpiper- June 2 *su* at Amana Lake several birds in large flock of peeps

- Bonaparte's Gull- May 2, 3, 4 near Amana Lake 2 birds
- Caspian Tern- May 8 and 23 on Amana Lake
- Veery- May 30(late) in Amana Woods *Veeries Red*
- Parula Warbler- May 17 and 30 in same location in Amana Woods as heard late spring last year.
- Cerulean Warbler- May 24 and June 2 in virtually same tree in Amana woods as last year.
- Connecticut Warbler- May 16 in Amana Woods.

Note: Amana Woods is on south side of river between Amana and Homestead.

Due to low water level on the Amana Lake for several weeks this spring, it proved to be a good spot for shore birds. In addition to the birds listed above the following were seen:
